
Monument of Jharkhand under Ranchi Circle







Palace & Temple Complex at Navaratangarh, Nagar (Doisagarh), Block: Sisai, Distt. Gumla, State: Jharkhand

Brief history of the monument:

The site along with some other localities in this area is popularly known as Navratnagarh. It was capital of Nagavanshi ruler of Jharkhand during late medieval period. In one tradition, the 49th king Shri Maharaj Raghunath Sah (in Nagpuria Nagvanshabali) of Naga Dynasty constructed the palace and temple in early 18th century, as mentioned in one of the inscription in the ruins whereas another tradition narrates that the 45th Raja Durjan Sal (in Nagpuria-Nagvanshabali) was constructed the capital and the buildings. He was proficient in recognizing real diamond and having pleased the sovereign on that account, secured release of himself and other princes like him.

PROPOSED WORK:

- Provision of tourist amenities i.e. Signage, Toilet Block etc.
- Provision of Souvenirs Shop, Clock Room etc.
- Development of pathway and approach road, construction of boundary wall mounted with iron grill and wire fencing, providing drainage, water harvesting etc.
- Development of landscape and garden within Navaratangarh Complex, Excavation & Scientific Clearance around Royal Palace and Illumination of Palace and Temple Complex, Navaratangarh
- Conservation of Monuments such as Jagannath Temple No. 1, 2, Kamal Shahi Mahal , Royal Palace etc.

Estimated cost of the proposed work is Rs. 2030 lakh
