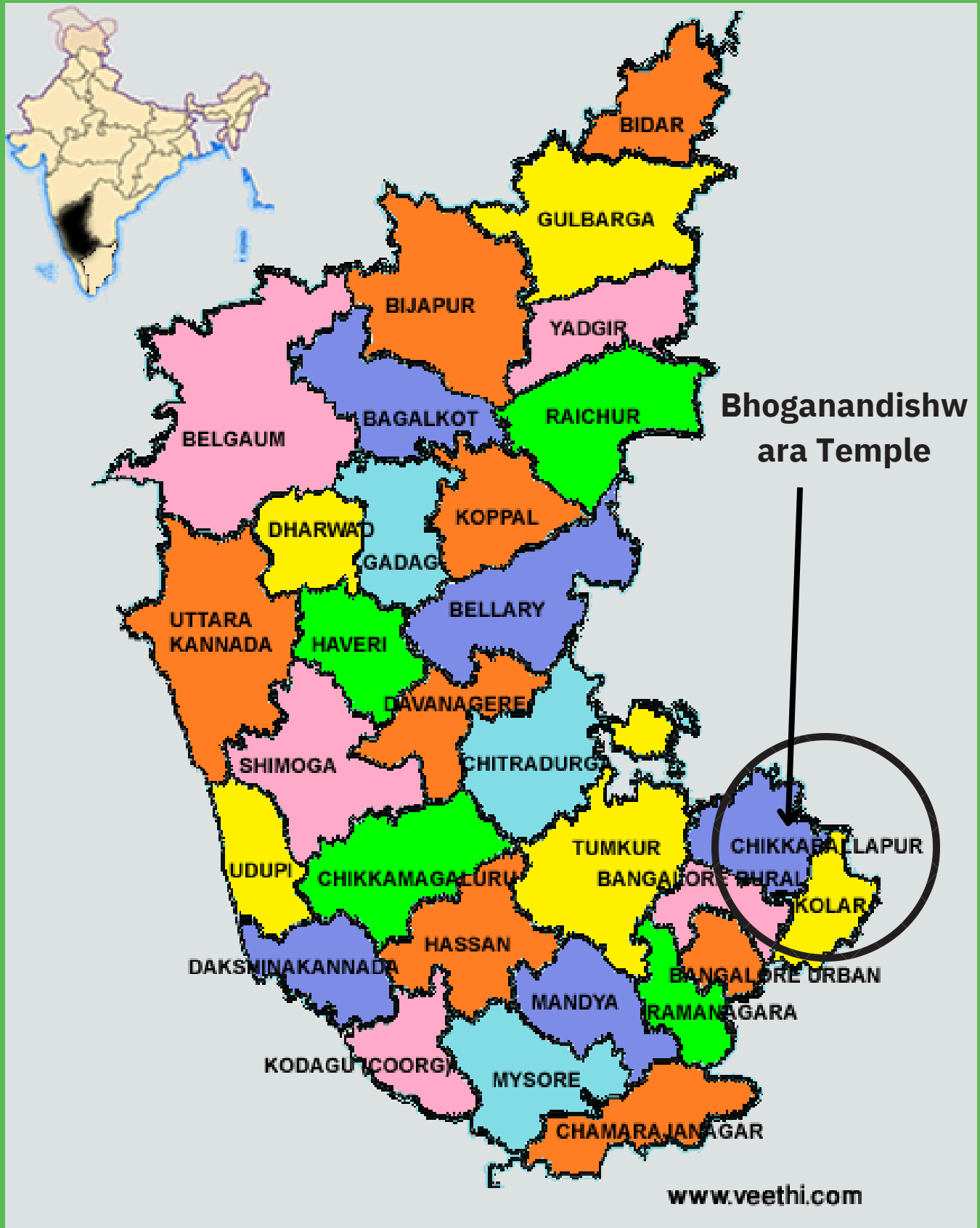

# Bhoganandishwara Temple, Dist. Chikkaballapur

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The Bhoganandisvara temple was constructed about the year 800 CE by Ratnavali, the queen of king Bana-Vidyadhara. The Banas, the Cholas, the Hoysalas, the Vijayanagar rulers and the Palegars had contributed to the construction of the temple and it ranged from circa 9th to 15th century CE.



- Resetting and Restoration of the stepped tank alongwith cloister Mandapa on the southern side of the temple
- Resetting of the mandapa of Mahanavami dibba.
- Landscaping development
- Illumination

# Fort and Dungeons, Dist. Hassan

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The Balam (Manzarabad) Palegars had their capital at Maninagapura (presently Aigur). From these Palegars, the area was annexed by Sivappa Nayaka of Ikkeri in 1659 CE and ultimately by Tipu Sultan in 1792 CE. The fort was constructed on the hill top by Tipu Sultan in 1792 CE at an altitude of over 987.8 m from the sea-level.

## PROPOSED WORK



- Providing proper approach to the Monument
- Dismantling and resetting of out of plumb fortification works, Lime plastering works
- Providing of amenities such as drinking water, toilet block, signage's
- Electrification works

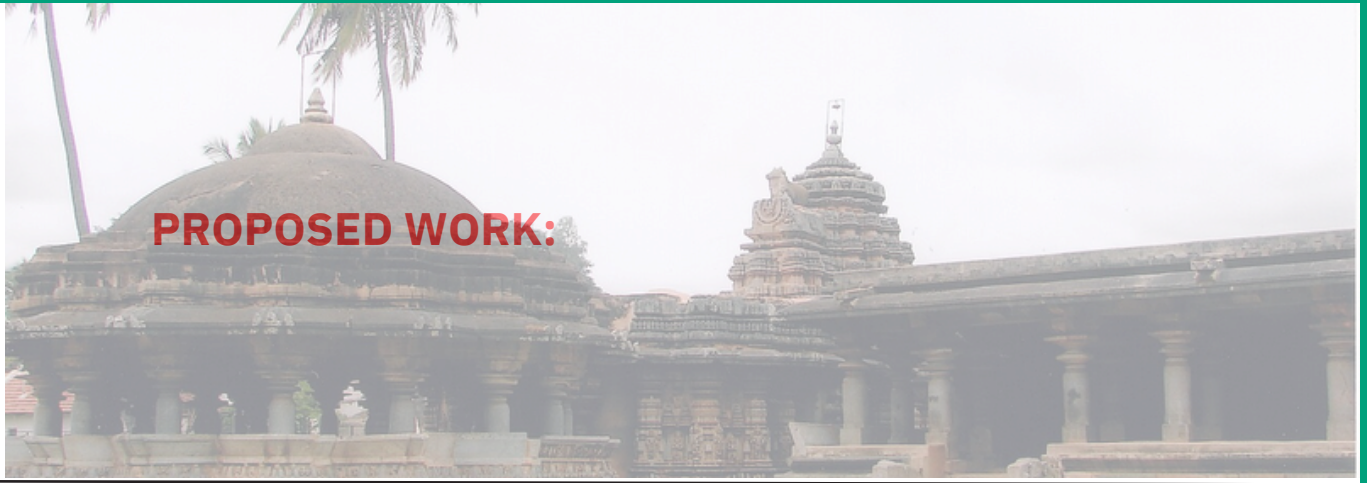




# Isvara temple Dist. Hassan

## **Brief history of the monument:**

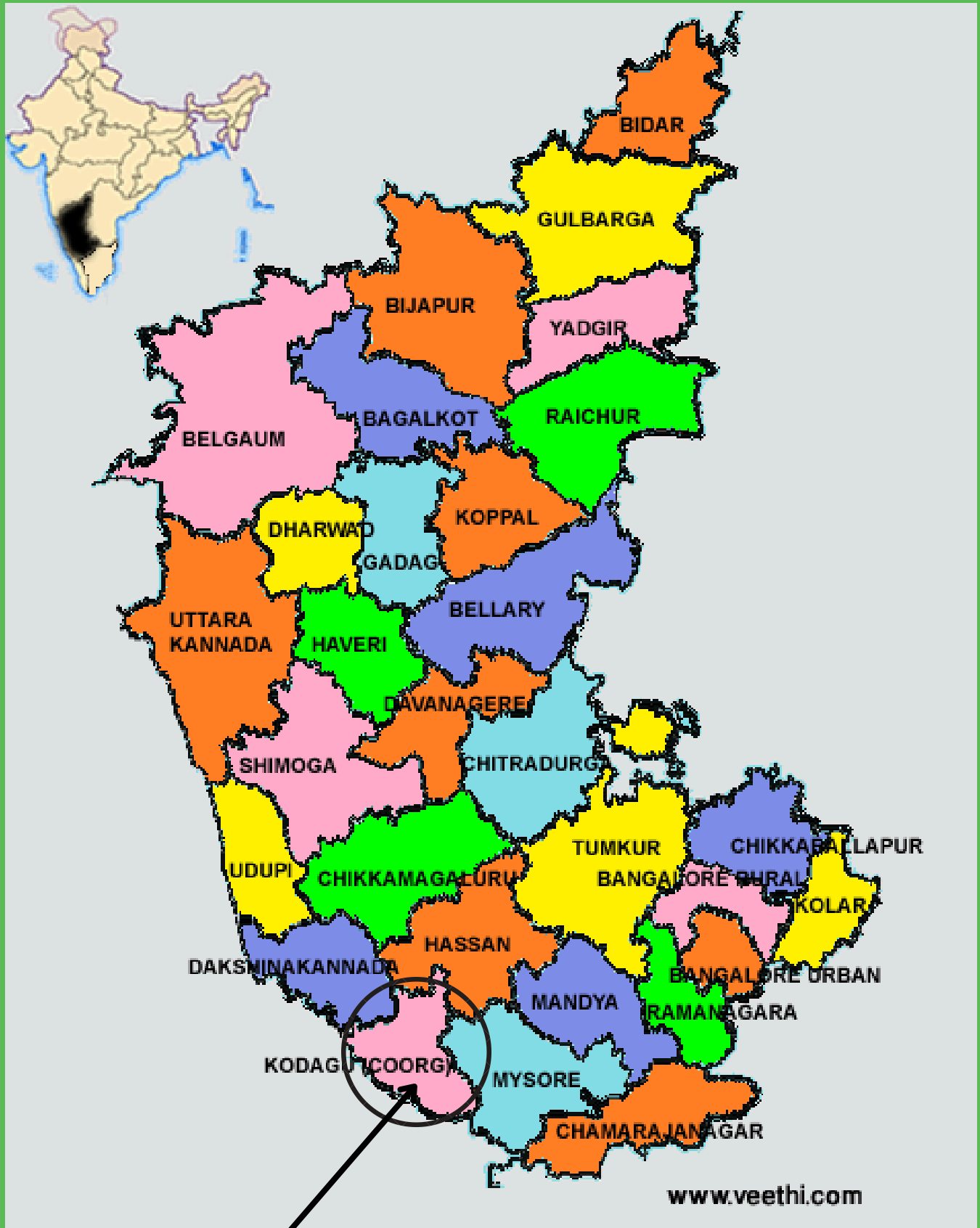
The Isvara temple on plan has a garbhagriha, antarala, navaranga, mahamandapa and a unique stellate mukhamandapa with two lateral entrances at north and south in between mahamandapa and mukhamandapa. To match the stellate mukhamandapa, even the plan of the sanctum and mahamandapa are highly indented so as to arrive at an almost stellate configuration at sanctum



- Dismantling and resetting of domed mukhamandapa.
- Strengthening of structure,
- Pointing of Sikhara to stop seepage of rain water
- Providing of architectural members wherever missing. etc..

# Fort and large Masonary Elephants, Dist. Coorg

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The fort wall built of stone masonry (granite), varies in thickness from 4.5m to 6.6m in places and the six corners of the ramparts are strengthened by circular bastions. A brick parapet of alternating merlons and embrasures, 5 feet high and 2 feet thick, constructed atop the ramparts along its outer edge, encloses the wall- walk within.

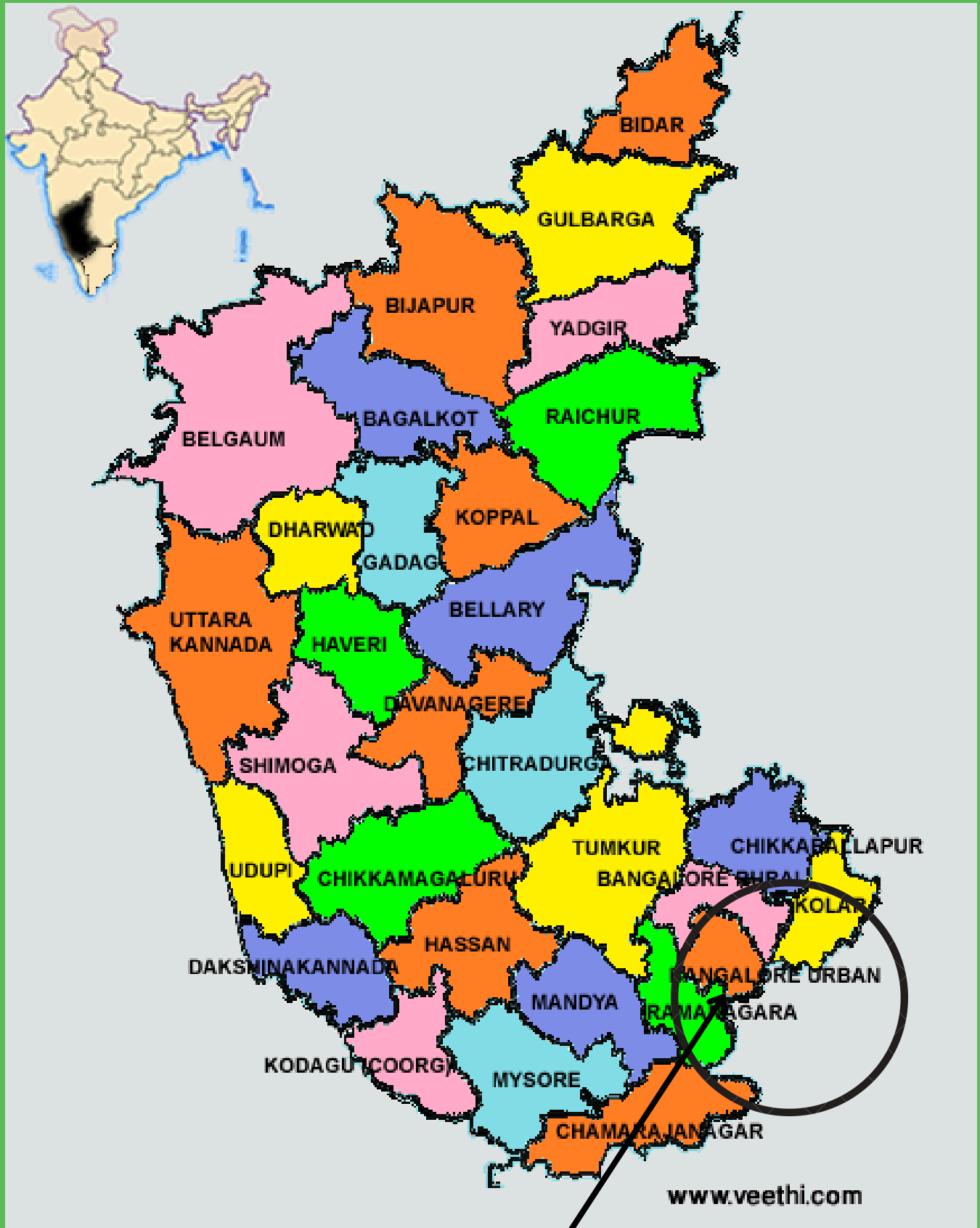

# Tipu Sultan's Palace, Dist. Bangalore Urban



## **Brief history of the monument:**

The construction of the palace of Tipu Sultan was begun by Haider Ali in 1781 CE and completed by Tipu Sultan in 1791 CE. This is the only splendid structure now extant within the old fort.

# Old Dungeon Fort and Gates, Dist. Bangalore

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The fort built by Chikkadevaraja was further strengthened by providing cyclopean stone veneering. Haider Ali also laid a beautiful garden known as Lalbagh which to this day survives in all its splendor.

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The Fort was built in about 1501 CE, by Mallabhaire Gowda of Avati, with the consent of Deva, a feudatory at Devanadoddi and changed the name of the place to Devanahalli.

# Aghoresvara temple Dist. Shimoga

## **Brief history of the monument:**

The Aghoresvara temple built in granite in north- south orientation during the time of Keladi rulers, is a classical example of the Nayaka style of architecture. It comprises of a garbhagriha, an open sukanasi (ardhamandapa) and a large mukhamandapa with a separate pavilion for nandi.



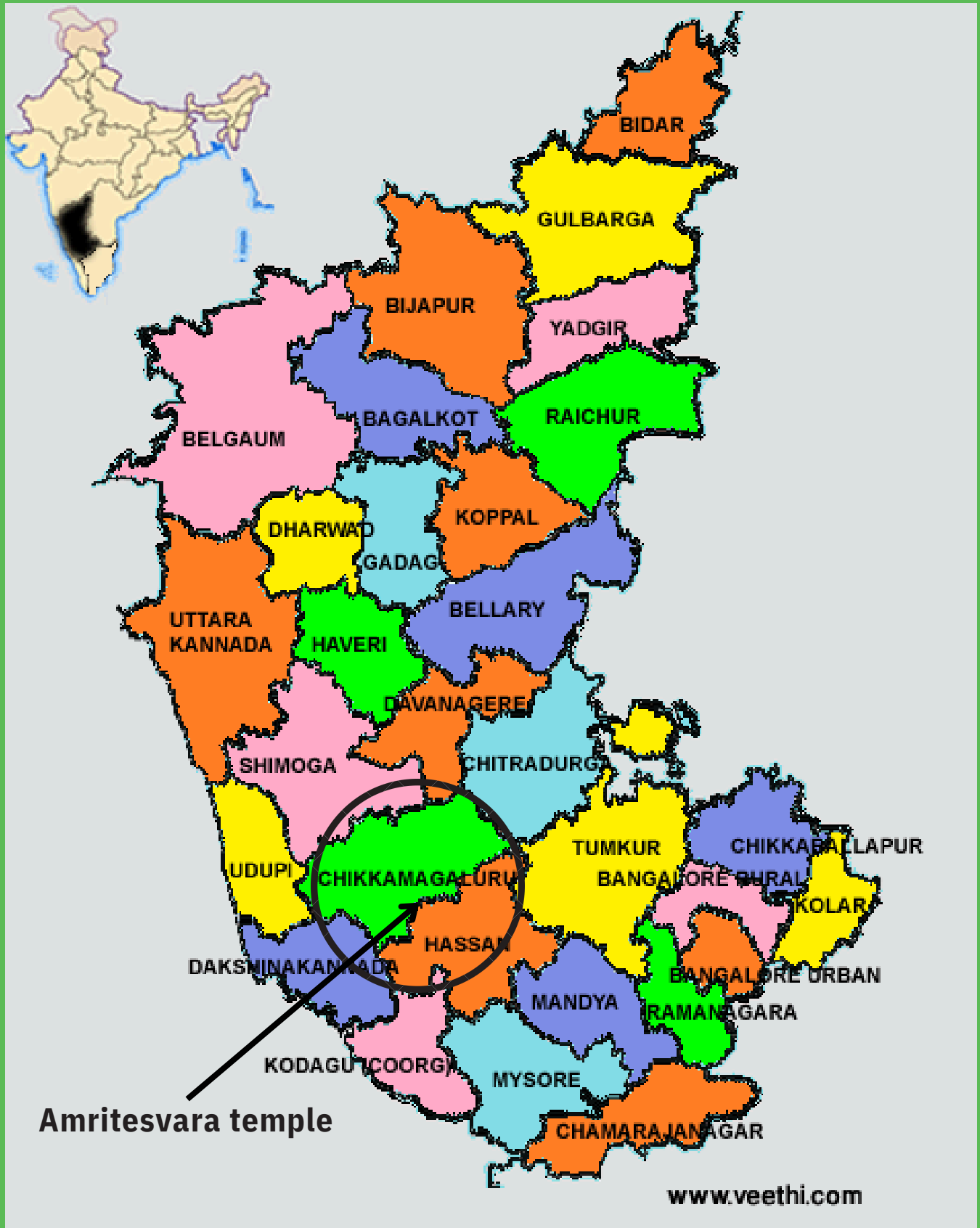
**PROPOSED WORK**

# Amritesvara temple Dist. Chikkamagaluru

## **Brief history of the monument:**

This is a compact, elegant ekatala temple facing east, built in 1196 CE by a Hoysala General Amritesvara Dandanayaka under Ballala II (1173-1220 CE).

- Conservation and Roof of the temple and Mandapas.

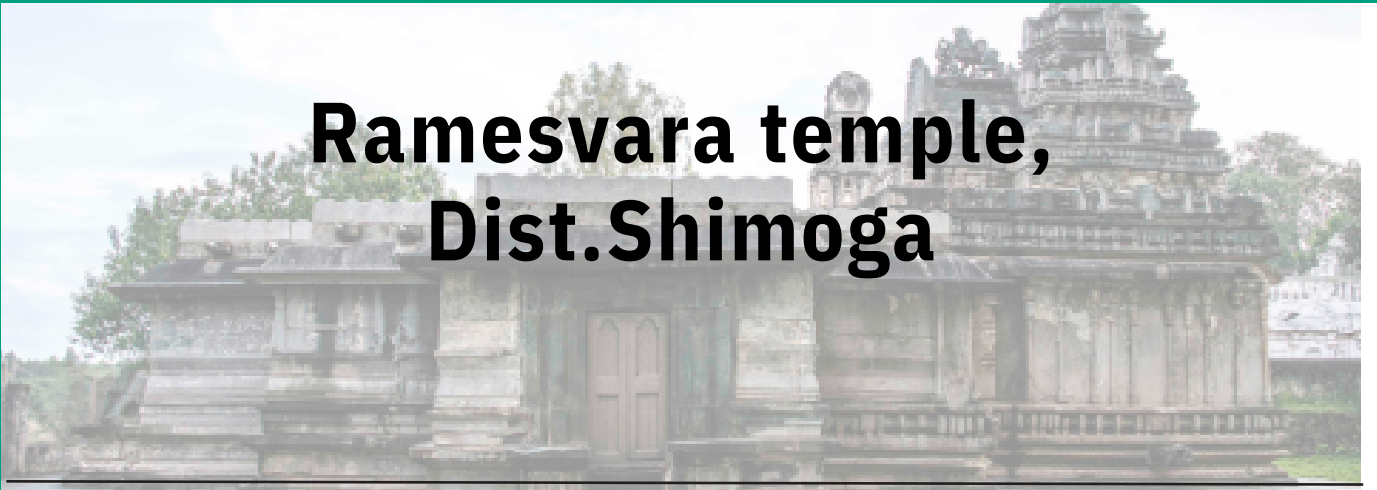

# Ramesvara temple, Dist.Shimoga



## **Brief history of the monument:**

The temple of Ramesvara is a medium sized structure built in mixed Hoysala and Dravida styles around 16th century CE. It is constructed of greenish grey schist stone in east-west orientation.

- Conservation of wooden members of the cloister Mandapa
- Construction of amenities center with Drinking water kiosk, toilets and baby care room etc.
- Landscaping
