Brief history of the monument:

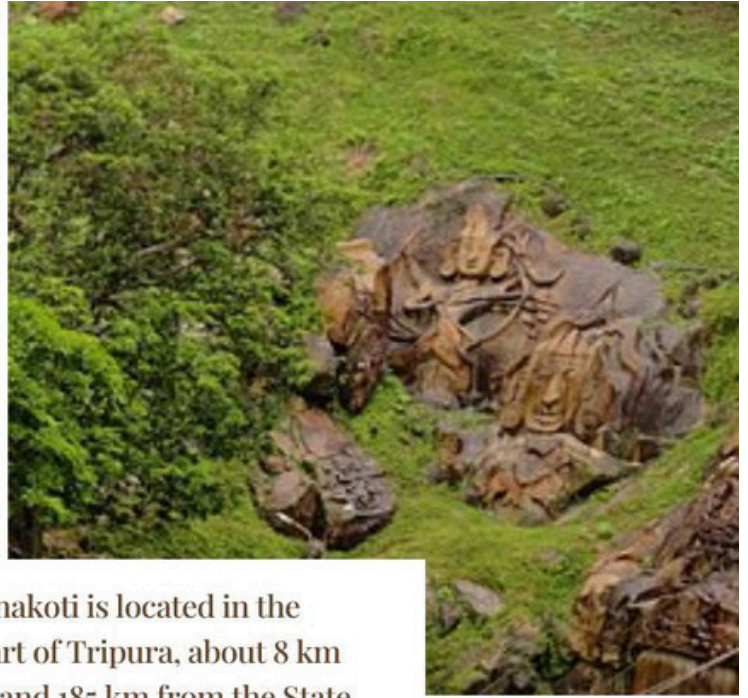
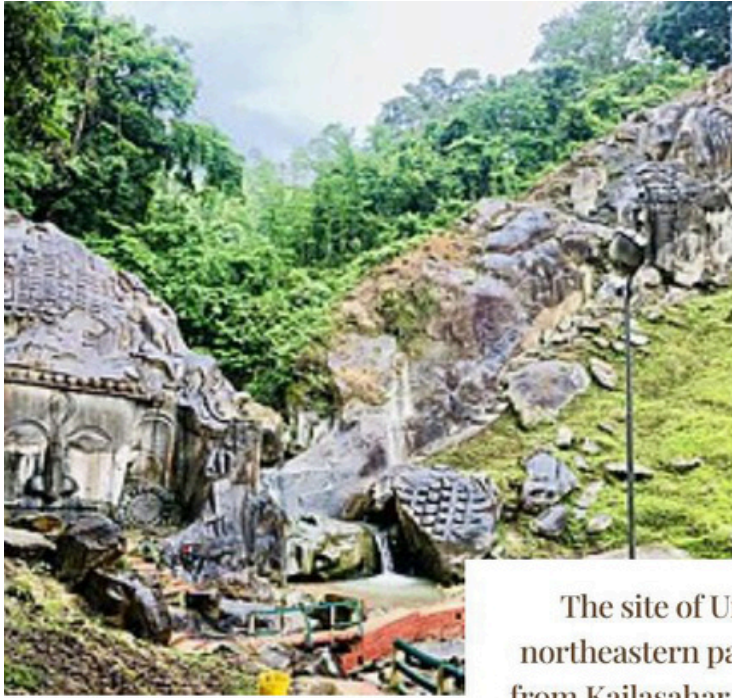
Unakoti is famed for its gigantic rock-cut panels of Hindu divinity. Unakoti means 'one less than a crore' which has importance among the locals as a place of the Saivas. Legend has it that Loard Shiva while going to Kasi rested for the night and told his fellow gods to wake and resume the journey before sunrise.



PROPOSED WORK:

- Provision for lighting & Illumination
- Braille Signage
- Drinking water, parking, tactile pathway
- Upgradation of cafeteria and other visitor amenities etc.

Estimated cost of the proposed work is Rs. 700 lakh



The site of Unakoti is located in the northeastern part of Tripura, about 8 km from Kailasahar and 185 km from the State capital Agartala.
