
Monuments of Odisha under Bhubaneswar Circle







Rajarani Temple and location: Bhubaneswar, Taluka: Bhubaneswar, District: Khordah

Area of the Monument: 4.78 Acres

Brief History of the Monument:

Rajarani Temple, facing east, consists of a Deul and a Jagamohana. Formerly known as the shrine of Indresvar Siva, the garbhagriha of this temple is now without a deity. But the presence of Saivite doorkeepers, the image of Lakulisa over the lintel, the scenes of Linga worship, Nataraja and Parvati on the platform and the pabhaga strongly indicate its association with Saivism. The name Rajarani is believed to have owed its origin to a particular variety of sand stone, locally known as Rajaraniya, of which the temple is made. The temple is pancharatha on plan and stands on a plinth consisting of three moldings. The bada is of panchanga type. The deul is noted for the well preserved standing dikpalas on the central facets of the kanikapagas of the lower jangha. Of these the figures of Agni and Varuna are noted for their masterly treatment. The temple is also remarkable for its tall and slender sophisticated nayikas carved in high relief and depicted in various poses and moods like in amorous dalliances, fondling her child, holding branches of trees, looking into the mirror, caressing her pet bird, playing on instruments, etc.

Area of the Monument: 8.10 Acres Brief history of the monument:

The hypaethral Chausathi Yogini temple at Jharial at Balangir district, near the administrative centre of the independent kingdom established by Janmejaya at the end of the 9" century, is situated at the top of the enormous outcrop of rock around which numerous temples were constructed. The temple is circular, as at Hirapur, through without exterior images or a projecting entrance. The exterior walls consist of five courses of stone, larger than those at Hirapur, crowned by a projecting eave and large semicircular coping. Only 48 of the original 64 yoginis have survived. They are carved from a soft, grainy sandstone which is rough and badly weathered.
