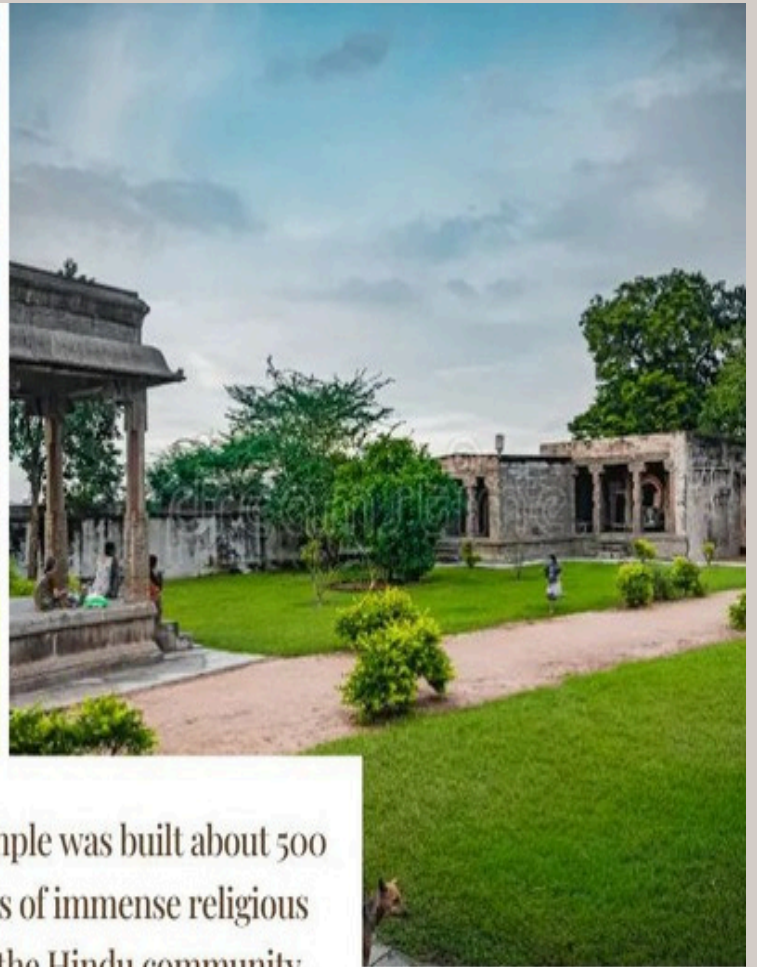
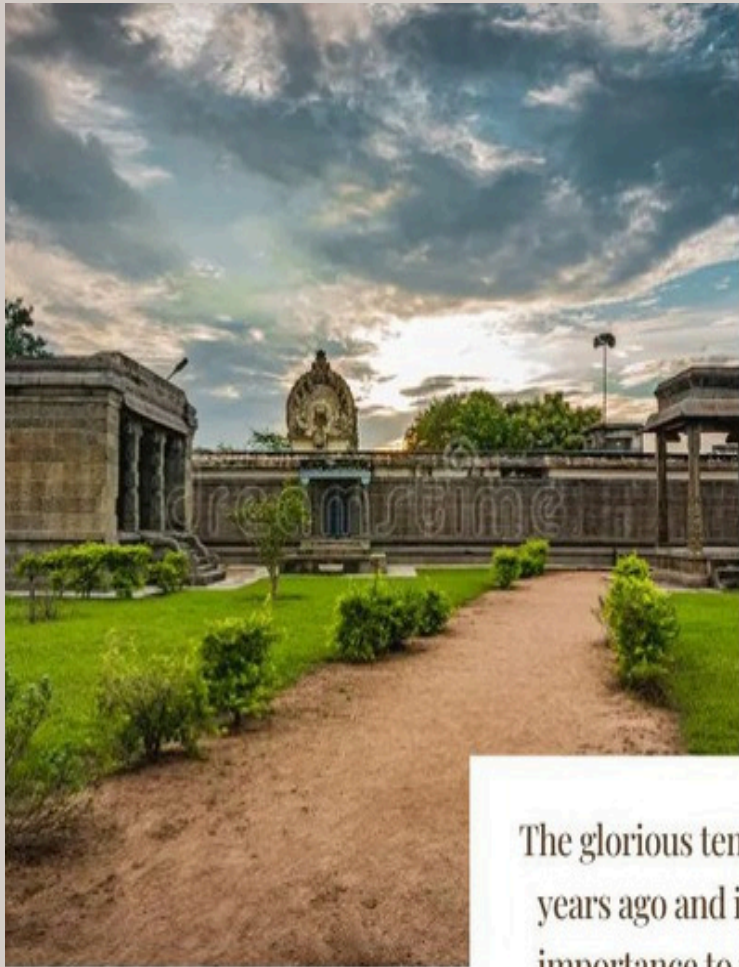
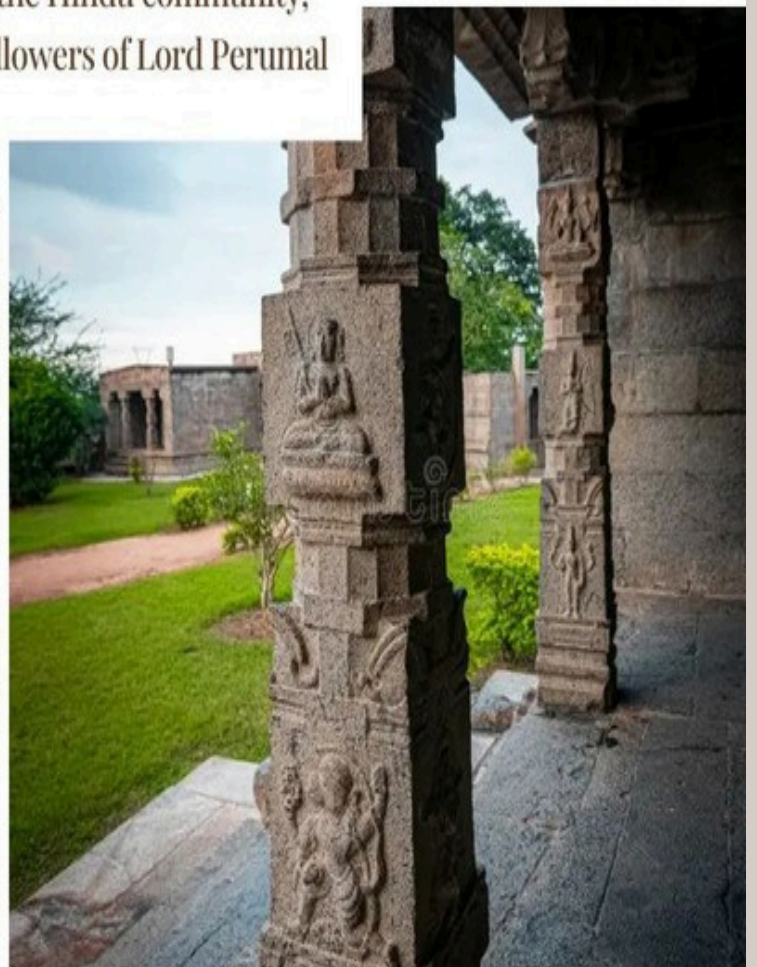


Monuments of Tamil Nadu under Chennai Circle

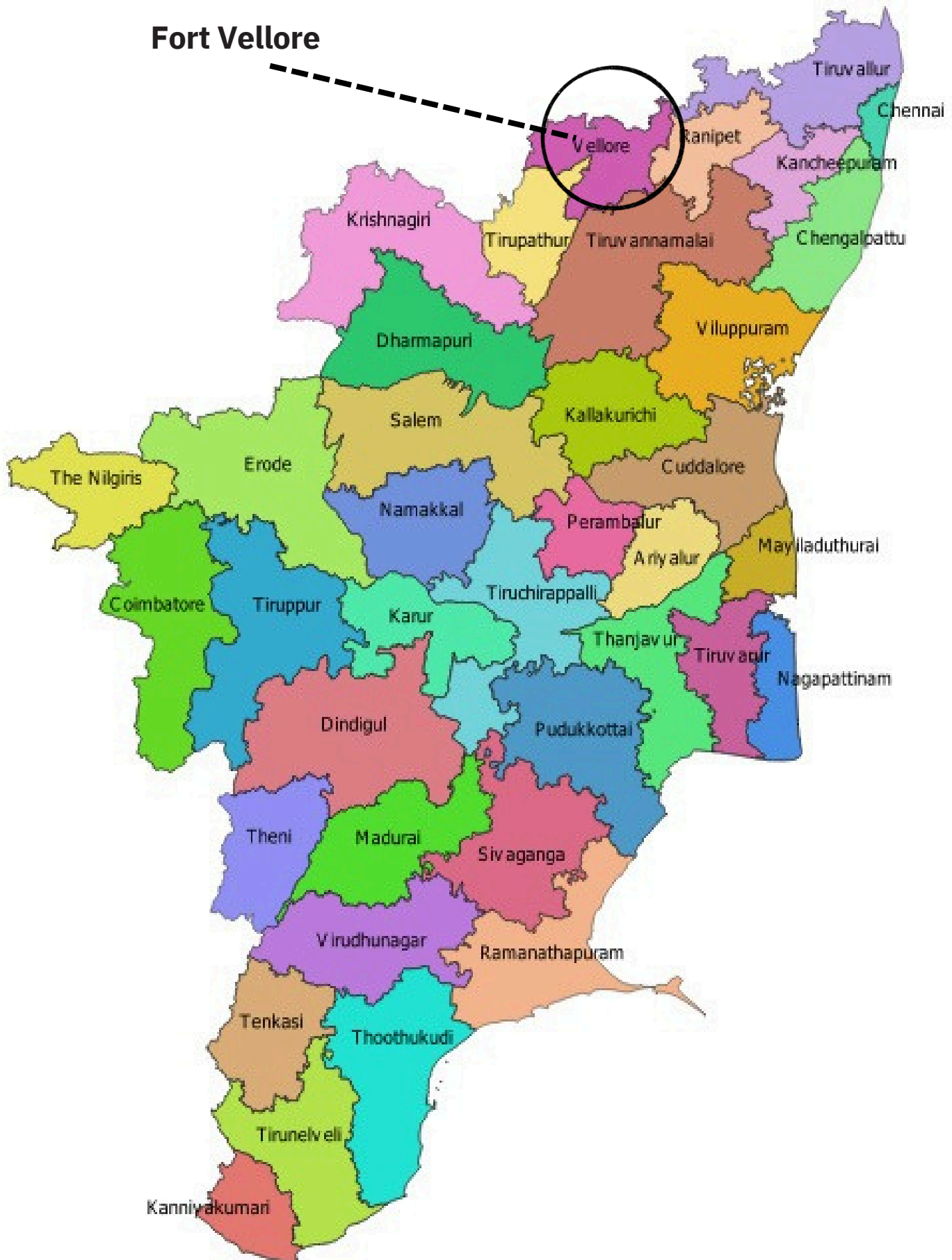


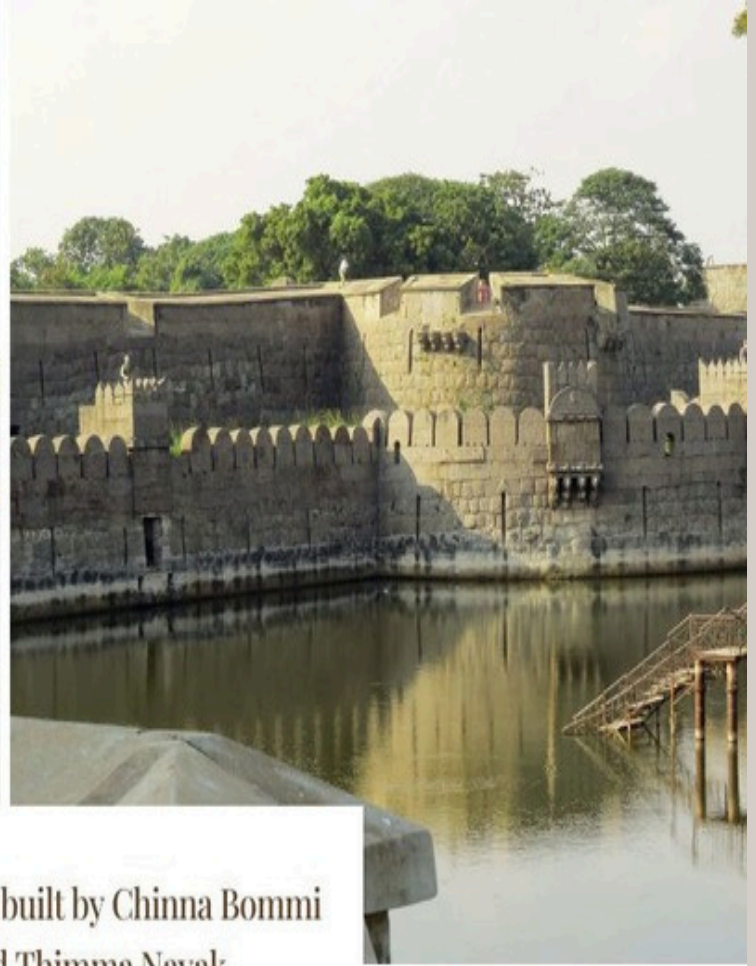
PROPOSED WORK:

PROPOSED WORK:

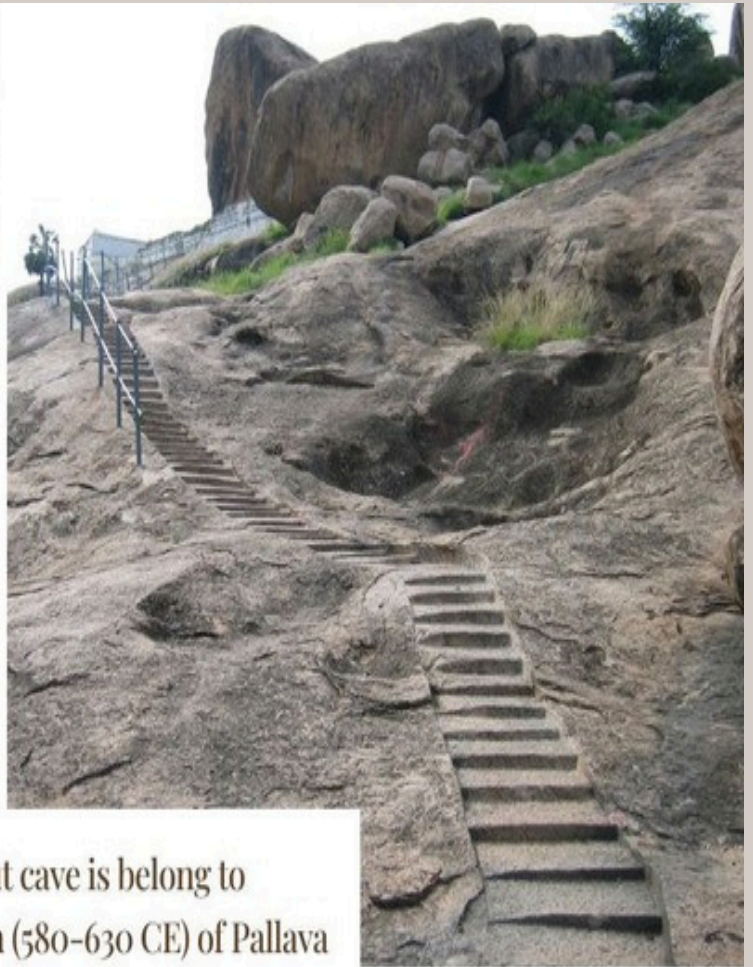
1. Maintenance / Up-gradation of Archaeological Garden on Western side of Fort Vellore (9.5 acres)

Brief history of the monument:

Vilapakkam is the hilly area locally known as panchapandva Malai was a flourishing Jaina centre during the early medieval periods as is evident from Rock cut cave temple, natural caverns with Jaina figures and inscriptions. Rock cut cave temple is a large excavation on the eastern face of the huge hill and its height is 4.5 ft. from the ground level with no provision for a flight of steps. The rock cut cave belongs to Mahendravarman (580-630 CE) of Pallava dynasty. It is dedicated to Jainism.

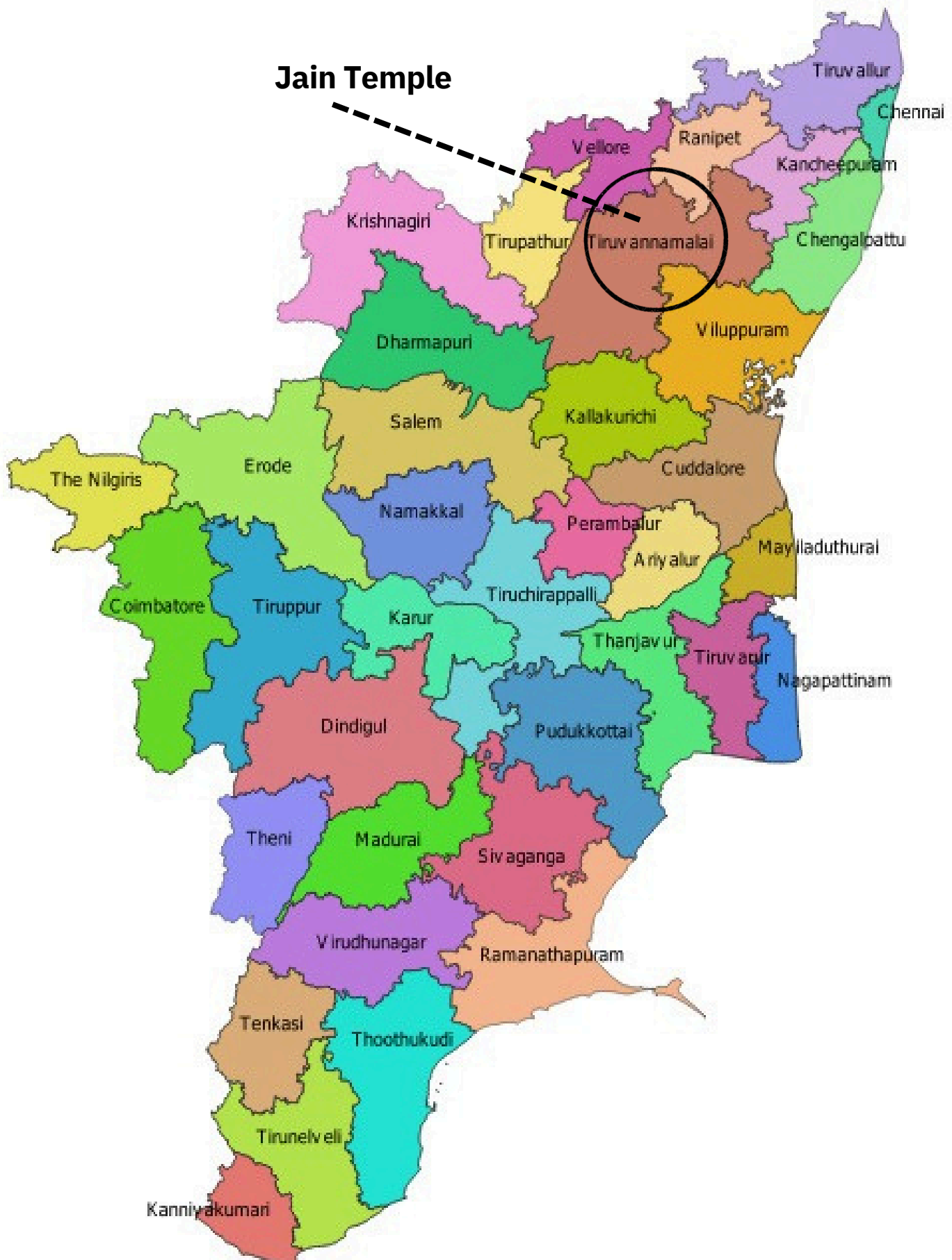

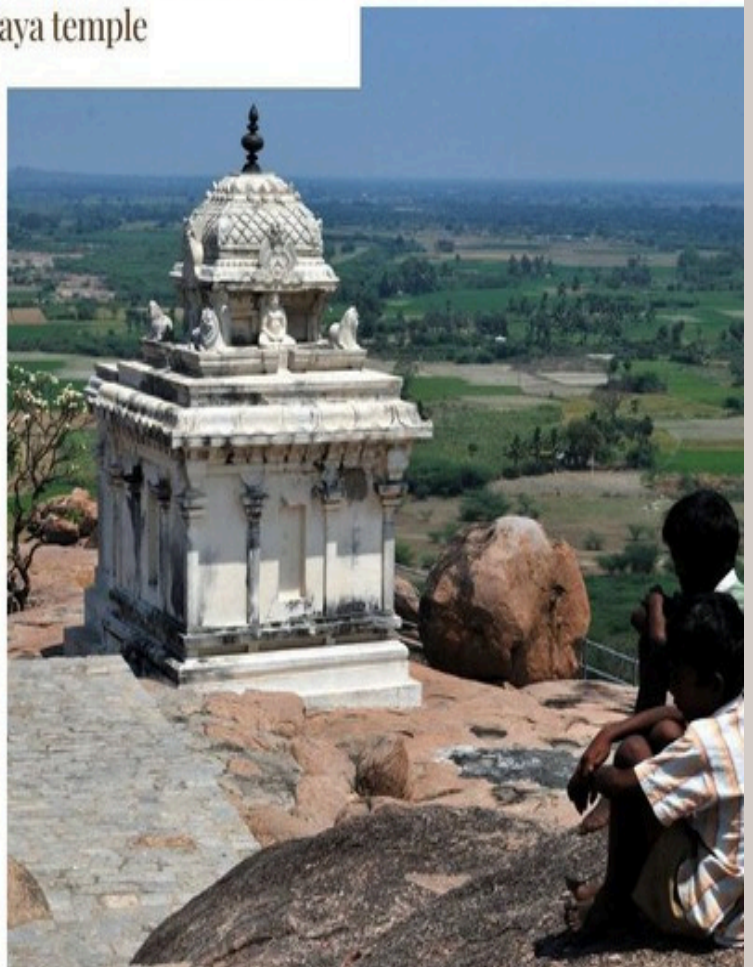

Jain Temple, Dist.Thirumalai

Brief history of the monument:

Tirumalai has been an important Jain center since ancient times. It is believed that 8,000 Jain monks who accompanied Bhadrabahu did the penance and attained nirvana here. The footprints of four great saints - Vrishabhsenachrya, Samanatabhadracharya, Varadattachrya munivar and Sri Vadeepa Simhasuri are also present here. An inscription dating back to 1024 CE is present mentioning the name Kunthavai Jinalaya temple.

1. Construction of New Toilet Block to the Visitors.
2. Drinking Water facility to the Visitors
