
Monuments of Uttar Pradesh under Lucknow Circle







The Ancient Site of Sankissa lying within the earthen rampart known as Bahir Kot, Dist. Farrukhabad

Brief history of the monument:

The Ancient Site of Sankissa lying within the earthen rampart known as Bahir Kot (27° 20' 3.145" N; 79° 16' 15.406" E), also known as Sankisa or Sankassa, is one of the 'Eight Great Places' of the Buddhist pilgrimage. It is situated in the Farrukhabad district of Uttar Pradesh. Sankisa or Sankissa, located about 37 kms west of Fatehgarh and about 40 kms far from Kannauj in north east, is of great historical importance. Sankisa has been mentioned in Sanskrit and Pali texts such as Ramayana, Tripitaka, Jataka and the accounts of Chinese travelers. The name of the place is written 'Sengkiashe' by the Chinese pilgrims, a spelling which is well preserved in the Sankisa of the present day, and which represents, with considerable faithfulness, the 'Sankasya' of Sanskrit. In Ramayana, it is mentioned as 'Sankasya' Nagar, which was ruled by king Kushadhwaja, a younger brother of Janaka. In Tripitaka, the place is believed to be the site where Buddha is said to have descended, with Brahma and Indra from the 'Trayastrinsa heaven' by a ladder of gold or gem, thus marking the place a centre of Buddhist pilgrimage.
