








Brief history of the monument:

It is a stone enclosure of pentagonal form around a group of temples. The loop hold parapets which give Garhwa a defensive appearance were built by Baghel Raja Vikramaditya of Bara about A.D. 1750. The oldest remains discovered here belong to the age of Guptas and include architectural relics of a temple.






Excavated site at Sringverpur, Distt. Prayagraj


Brief history of the monument:





Lord Cornwallis Tomb at Ghazipur, Distt. Ghazipur


Brief history of the monument:
