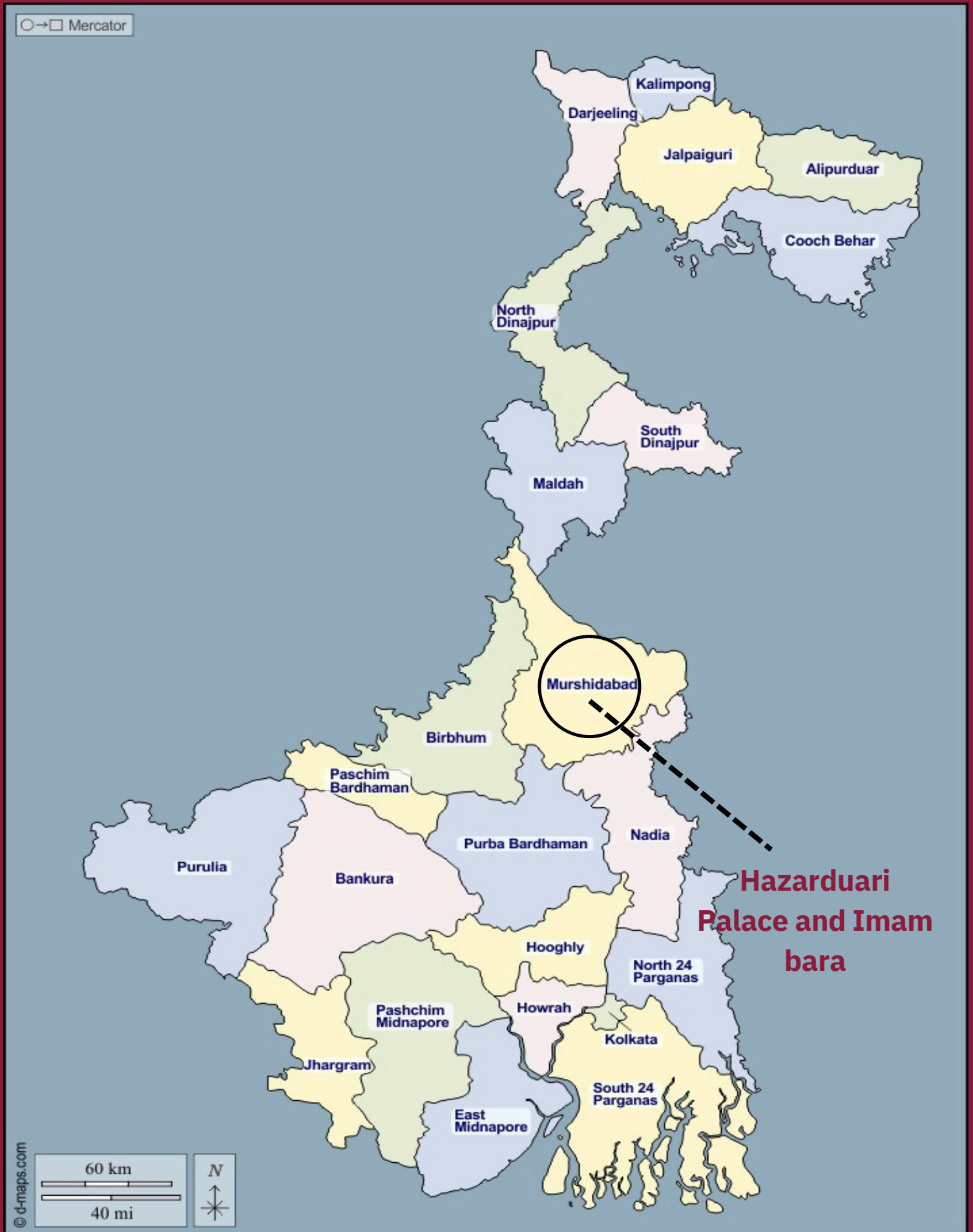

Hazarduari Palace and Imambara, Dist. Murshidabad

Brief history of the monument:

Hazaduari Palace was built during 1829 CE to 1837 CE in the region of Nawab Nazim Humayun Jah under the supervision of Colonel Mcleod Duncan. The three storied palace was constructed in Indo European style of architecture. This palace is rectangular in plan measuring 127 m x 62 m x 27 m. It was used for holding Durbar or Royal court and other officials works the Nawabs as well as the residence of high-ranking British Officials. Bricks and lime surki mortar are prime components of this building.

PROPOSED WORK:

- Laying Tactile Pathway
- Sand stone flooring
- Lime tracing of floor
- Illumination
- Face lifting of the Hazarduari Palace Museum and
- Installation of RO plant etc.

Adina Mosque

Brief history of the monument:

This mosque was the largest mosque in medieval times only in Bengal but also in the whole of the subcontinent. It was, according to an inscription at its back wall, built in 1373 CE by sikandar shah, son of illiash shah. Sultan sikandar shah, the second sultan of ilyas shahi dynasty, declared himself to be the 'most perfect for the sultans of Arabia and persia' in 1369 ad. It is a quadrangular building consisting of cloisters, which surround a central area of the same form. It extends 507.5 ft from north to south and 285.5 ft from east to west. On the east side, through which the building is entered by an insignificant door, the cloisters are 38 feet wide, and have 3 aisles. A beautiful ornamental piece of architecture within the nave to its northwest corner and on the right side of the principal mihrab is the stone pulpit.

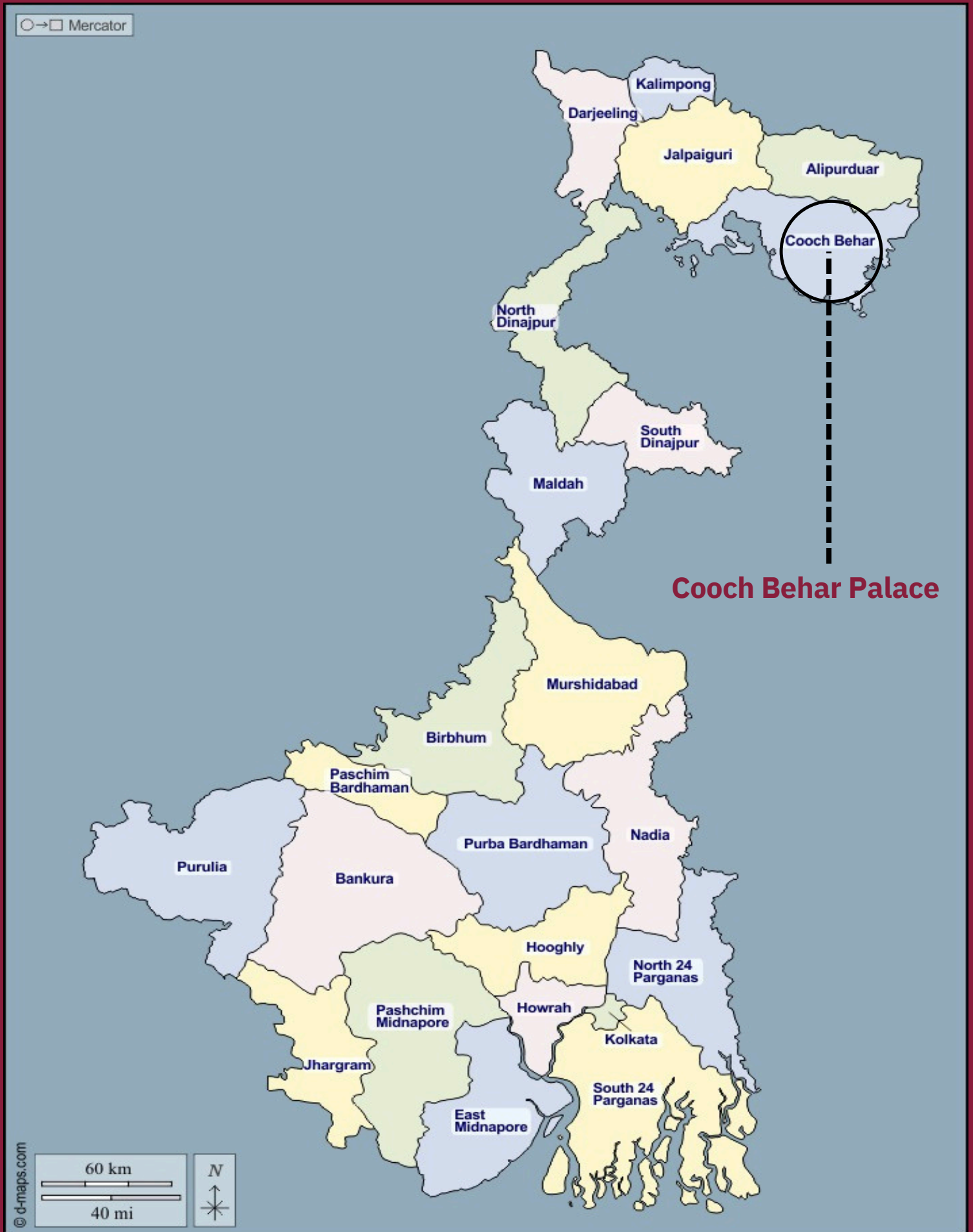

Brief history of the monument:

Cooch Behar palace was built by Maharaja Nripendra Narayan Singh of Koch dynasty. It is a two storied building made of bricks. It was designed in the Italian Renaissance architecture style and was built in 1887. It measures 120 m long and 90 m wide. The striking feature of this palace is durbar hall with metal dome which was supported by Corinthian pillars.

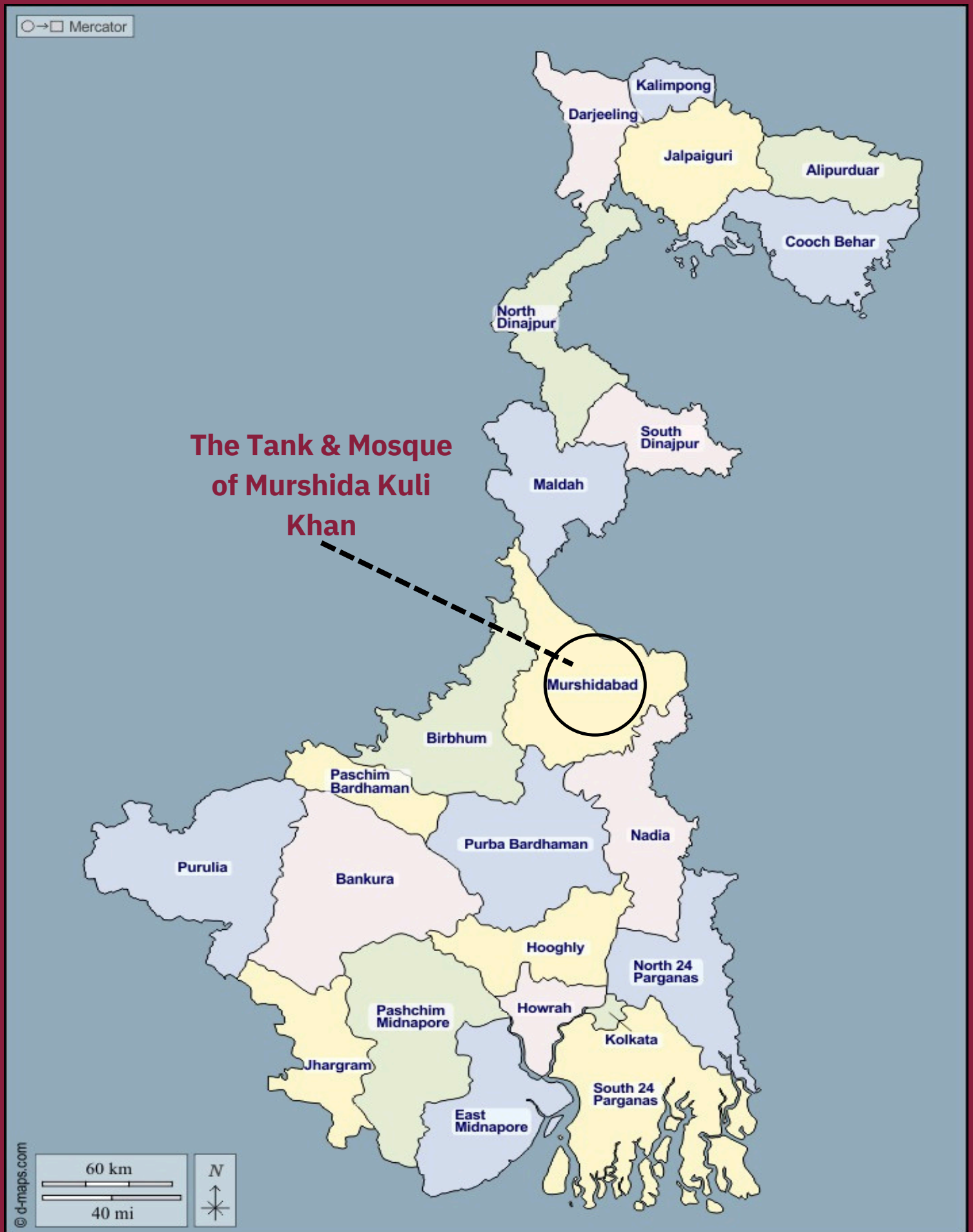


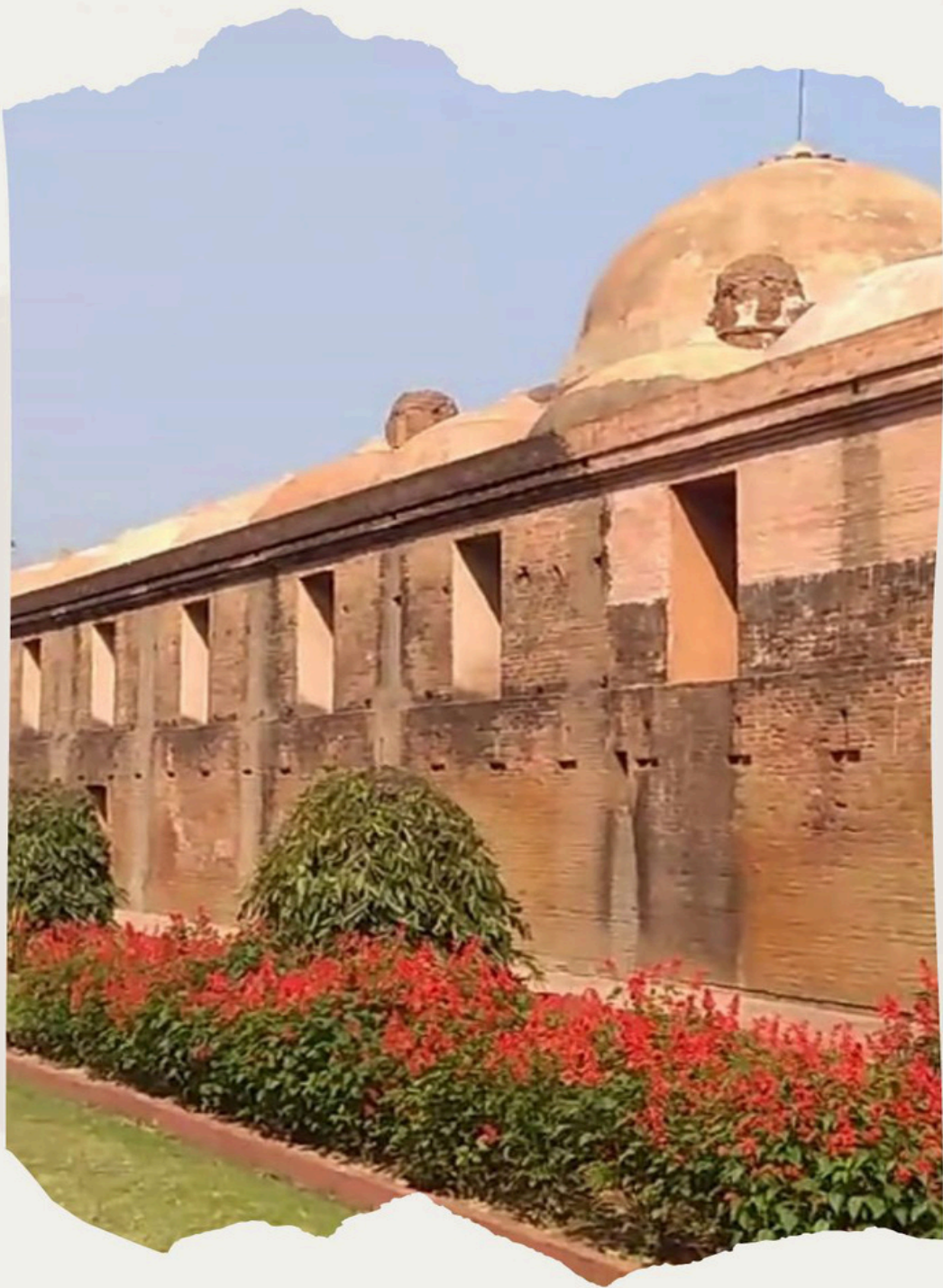

The Tank & Mosque of Murshida Kuli Khan, Dist. Murshidabad

Brief history of the monument:

The mosque was constructed in 1724-25 by Murshid Kuli Khan according to an inscription over the east fayade. Murshida Kuli Khan officially transferred the capital of Bengal from Dhaka to Murshidabad in 1717, a city he named in honour of himself. This mosque also contains the grave of Murshid Kuli Khan under the staircase. It had five domes but now two are survived. The two-storey domed cells round the mosque and the terrace which accommodated seven hundred karis or Koran readers. The most striking feature of this mosque is four huge minarets at each of the corner but today two are extant.

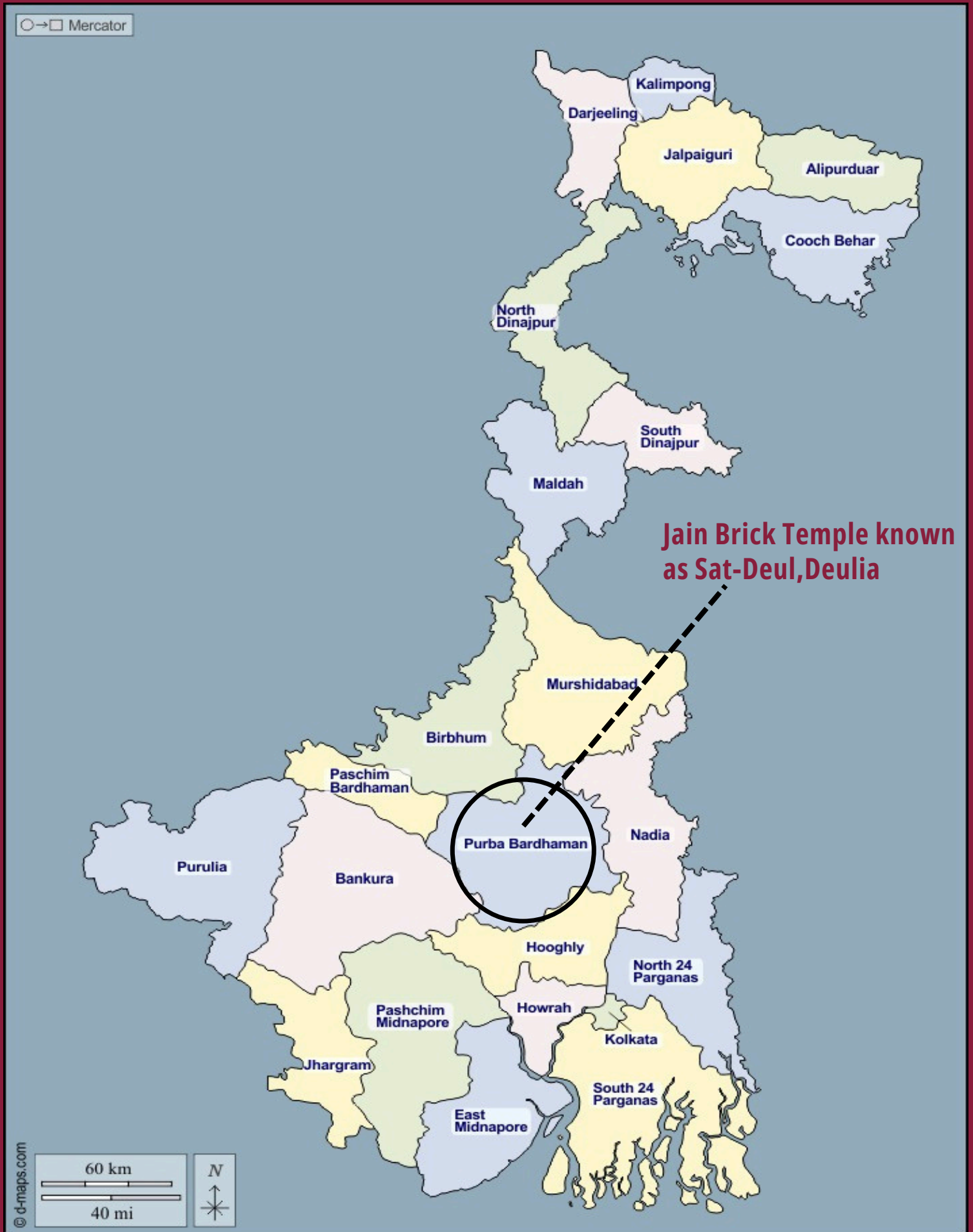



Jain Brick Temple known as Sat-Deul, Deulia, Dist- Purba Bardhaman

Brief history of the monument:

The monument is located (lat.23° 09' 04" N. long. 88° 02' 38" E) in village deulia of the sub division and district Purba Bardhaman. The site was declared as a centrally protected monument vide preliminary notification No. S.O. 2655. The site is well connected by the train and bus. The nearest railway station and bus stop is memari or masagram. The monument is under the administrative control of ASI and non-living. This deserted brick temple seems to be one of the oldest brick temples in Bengal. It appears to have once enshrined a Jaina Divinity which was discovered at the site now kept in the sanctum.

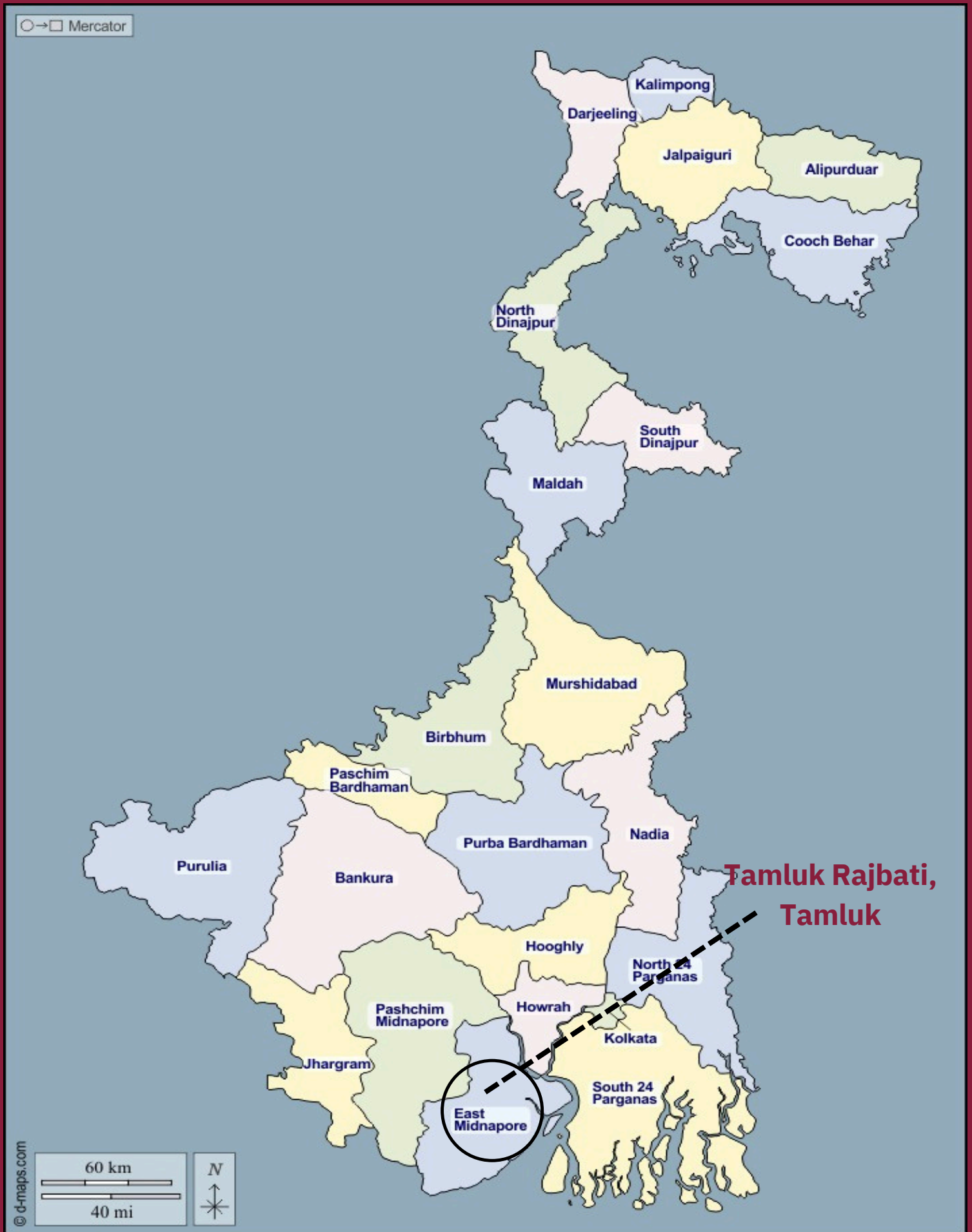


PROPOSED WORK:

- a) Conservation work of the monument & exposing of buried structures and their restoration with special size bricks. Details architectural documentation etc.
- b) Under the public amenities, upgradation of the old damaged toilet block, benches, signages, drinking water facility and child care room etc.
- c) Repairs of the boundary wall and main entrance.
- d) Pathway, landscaping, gardening and plantation is required for the beautification of the monument.

Estimated cost of the proposed work is Rs. 135 lakh

Tamluk Rajbati, Tamluk, Dist- Purba Medinipur

Brief history of the monument:

The Rajbari complex is situated in the suburban area of Tamluk town of sub-division and district Purba Midnapur. The town is well connected by road and rail transport. The Rajbari or palace was declared as a centrally protected monument. The temple is under administrative control of ASI and lands under private ownership. The palace is located on the western bank of Khat Pukur located between the river Rupnarayana Subarnarekha.



PROPOSED WORK:

- a) Conservation work of the monument & exposing of buried structures and their restoration with special size bricks. Details architectural documentation etc.
- b) Under the public amenities, upgradation 01 the old damaged toilet block, benches signages, drinking water facility and child care room etc.
- c) Repairs of the boundary wall and main entrance.
- d) Pathway, land scaping, gardening and plantation is required for the beatification the monument.

Estimated cost of the proposed work is Rs. 185
